

Arrest, charge, conviction of solicitors or employees

If someone we regulate is arrested, charged or convicted the situation may have an impact on [clients](https://news.sra.org.uk/consumers/using-solicitor/legal-jargon-explained#client) [<https://news.sra.org.uk/consumers/using-solicitor/legal-jargon-explained#client>]. It may also affect the person's ability to practise. We may need to take action to protect clients.

If you discover that a person regulated by us has been arrested, charged or convicted of an offence, you should report them to us **immediately**:
