Decision details

Stephen Abenson was adjudged bankrupt on 19 April 2024. As such, his 2023/2024 practising certificate was automatically suspended.

The suspension of Mr Abenson's practising certificate has been terminated subject to the following conditions.

- 1. Mr Abenson is not a manager or owner of any authorised body.
- 2. Mr Abenson may not practise on his own account under Regulation 10.2(a) or (b) of the SRA Authorisation of Individuals Regulations.

In these conditions the terms are as defined in the SRA Glossary.

Reasons/basis

The above conditions are necessary in the public interest. They are reasonable and proportionate having regard to the purposes set out in regulation 7 of the SRA Authorisation of Individuals Regulations, and the regulatory objectives and principles governing regulatory activities as contained in section 28 of the Legal Services Act 2007.
